On the Way Together

There's an apocryphal story that I learned in my youth regarding my great-great-great grandparents who happened to be French Canadian. It's said that these relatives on my mother's side were stalwart Roman Catholics, and as they attempted to make a living for themselves on their farm, life wasn't always easy. It's said that one day my great-x3 grandparents were visited by their priest. The priest didn't come for a pastoral call, but instead came to ask for money. Apparently he needed a new carriage, and he was collecting from his parish the funds necessary to buy it. My ancestor, Sam, after a little thought, told the priest he simply could not afford to contribute to the fund for a new carriage at this time. In response, the priest is reported to have told him, "Well, Sam, then you are going straight to hell!" Strangely enough, my relatives became Methodist shortly thereafter.

I share this story not because I think that the Roman Catholic Church and all priests are corrupt. To the contrary, I have met and admire many Roman Catholic sisters and brothers. But I share this story because its history and how it was told to me when I was young definitely affected how I would allow myself to relate to those who happened to be Roman Catholic in my younger years. It wasn't until I was almost through seminary that I truly came to terms with how that story colored how I saw others. For myself, and for others in my family, that story - and hundreds of years of Protestant-Roman Catholic rivalry - has become a barrier between people of faith who have so much in common.

It's for this reason I'm so excited about how the Lutheran church has chosen to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation. We have decided that instead of celebrating, we must observe and honor the sacrifices made and the journey that we have been on. It is for this reason that we have been in conversation and partnership with the Roman Catholic Church. Despite the ways that we have been at odds in the past, and the hurt over the initial split between Protestant and Roman Catholic churches, over the past fifty years it has become increasingly apparent that there is far more that unites us than divides us. As we enter into a new future, we are finding that we have many unique ways in which we are invited to be partners in ministry. Often we advocate for the same causes of justice in our world. Many times Lutheran Social Services and Catholic Charities form complimentary relationships in the work that we do for the less fortunate. And in all things, we are guided by the Holy Spirit to be a reflection of the light that God shines on all of us.

Are the Lutheran Church and Roman Catholic Church without differences today? No, we still have some differences that need to be worked out. We aren't exactly the same. But now, more than ever, we see a path that we can travel together for the sake of our common mission in the world. Now, more than ever, our journey is one that points not to our differences but rather what unites us - Christ our lord, who is and will continue to be the source of our mission here on earth. May we continue to seek what unites us rather than what divides.


