Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

It was an eerie Friday morning when "Gray Lady II" and I got up and ready for another day. Apparently, Arizona had some wild fires burning and the prevailing winds were from the west. It was still dark when I went out to the driveway to get our copy of the Albuquerque Journal. So everything looked like any other Friday morning in mid-to-late June.

The two different colored trash receptacles were out in front of most of the homes in our neighborhood. The blue ones for recycling and the black for trash; neatly placed up against the curb, five feet apart. Our trash gets picked up early in the morning and the recycling in the afternoon. All was as it was supposed to be.

Mary had her coffee and I had loaded up "Gray Lady II" with the stuff I needed for the morning. By now, it was day light and yet as I was putting my briefcase in the back seat I had not looked at the Sandias or noticed the filtering effect of the smoke against the sun. That was to come.

While driving on Coors Bypass, heading to All Saints Lutheran Church to do some preparation for the weekend and next week, I still paid little attention to the mountains, as I was more concerned about the traffic. It was not until I got into the church making my way to their library did I full take in what the smoke was doing to our region. I looked out from the library windows and took in the sight that the Sandias were not visible. I was sure they were still there, hidden by the smoke, but I could not make them out. Just amazing what something out of our area of life can affect us.

The weather person Thursday, had foretold me that this was to unfold, but passed it off. People with breathing issues were told to stay inside and be cautious of the air quality and its risks. No concern to me. Most dramatically the encroachment of smoky air could have negative effects on an otherwise normal Friday in June.

"Gray Lady II" and I were going to do our best to carefully get through the day. It did prompt me to ponder how we deal with a change of effect to our daily living and assumptions. As "Gray Lady II" and I were on our way from ASLC to get fuel for her (I did not want her to become famished with an empty tank of fuel.), and then go to play tennis, I posited her with a question, "How do we react, especially to a positive change in our daily life, to an overwhelming variation to our thoughts, conceptions, routines and/or practices?







### TRASH AND NEEDLE CLEAN-UP

We appreciate all our volunteers whom take time to keep our church property nice looking and inviting. We also want you to be safe. We have purchased three tongs for picking up trash and needles so please do not pick up with your hands. The tongs and Sharps Container are located in the upper cupboards across from the bathroom in the old kitchen just outside the reading room. When picking up discarded hypodermic needle, put the needle in the Sharps Container. It opens by matching up the white arrows. The procedure is to place Sharps Container on the ground (do not hold it), then pick up needle with designated tongs, stand a little away from container and drop into container. When you can see the needle(s) are securely laying on the bottom, close tightly the container and then put back in cupboard. Thank you.

### STUDENT AND YOUTH MINISTRY
