#### **RIDES WITH "OLD SHIFTER"**

I remember when I lived up in the Upper Midwest my vehicles did get a kind of fuel line ailment. The picture was of a sign put up by the city traffic folks and it looked like road direction signs one would see anywhere. It read, "Complete stop, FREE; Rolling stop \$154.38 (I do not remember the actual amount, so I came up with this one. You get the picture.).

Every day advice and directives are shared with us at some level of earnestness. We do have free will but it does not come without responsibilities and consequences. When I need to come to a stop at an intersection or coming up behind a vehicle, "Old Shifter" needs to apply the brakes when I push on the brake pedal. It is an imperative response to a consequential event. "Old Shifter" does have the option to not function at my request, but it would not be good for either of us.

I believe that our Holy Bible is the ultimate source and true directive as we navigate this world. As we study the Bible we receive such thought provoking insights and solid considerations for how we are to be faithful people of God, and for his creation. God speaks to us through those Holy Scriptures and challenges us to look to where we have been and where we are going. 

#### **REPORT ON NORTH NM W-ELCA CLUSTER EVENT**

The event was held on Saturday, January 20, 2018, in Albuquerque at St. Timothy Lutheran Church. Over 50 women attended this inspiring event titled, "Be the Light of the World - Celebrating Evangelism Everyday."

The questions posed during the event were:

- How do we reach the unchurched?
- How do you talk to those "outside" the church?
- How can we individually share our love of church and the importance of its influence on our lives?

Pastors Rachael Powell and Bre Roberts acted out mock scenes that portrayed examples how Christians may possibly be off-putting because of their excitement to speak about Jesus and their church. They also acted out mock scenes that may portray best practice methods of how Christians can create a more lasting relationship with unbelievers who in turn may want to find out more about our faith. After their presentation, the audience was asked to do the same exercise and were given three hypothetical scenarios. The women loved the exercise but some mentioned that they found it hard to evangelize without coming on too strong about their faith.

We had a special guest from Tennessee, Ms. Dolly (a.k.a. Rhonda Bentz) Parton, who sang "He is High and Mighty".

The event was very successful with lunch catered from Baggin's Gourmet Sandwiches. We were also asked to bring in-kind donations for the Storehouse and St. Tim's collection bin.
