"Old Shifter" and I were driving down Menaul heading back across town from a good morning at Messiah. "Old Shifter" and I had the pleasure of deciding where would we go to buy a pizza for "Pizza Night at the Mathison Home."

This particular Thursday would be one of the special ones we have every other week because Mary would have the next three days off, and not be responsible for the "on call" telephone. Our household has had this tradition, Thursday Night Pizza, since our time serving a parish in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin. Even when I was in Hobbs and Mary in Albuquerque for those seven and a half months, "Old Shifter" and I would go to a pizza parlor and celebrate Pizza Night on Thursdays. We never missed a week, I do not think.

Over the those many years past in Wisconsin and Iowa before moving down here, I had different trusted wheels which brought home pizza. There was "Old Blue" a 1973 Ford F100 pickup, and her successor "Gray Lady" a 1974 Ford Ranger. All my companions over the years new the significance of our family tradition and were always excited when the trip was at hand for a pizza purchase. They never let us down.

Tradition is more than just a routine habit, it is also something greatly to be anticipated. No matter whatever else was going on before or after Thursday night, I knew with great anticipation that there would be this blessed event. Our family lives would slow down for this moment, even if our kids had other earlier or later activities that day or evening. It was a constant. It was us.

Sunday mornings (or Saturday nights) would be another of our focuses for the week. Even if our kids had other responsibilities during the weekend, worshipping our Lord was a paramount activity in our household. It was more than tradition, it was a moment set apart to be cherished and honored. Yes there were times, just like Pizza Night, when honoring our attention to the worshipping our Lord would be challenged by the requests of other activities and work. But we tried our best to see that the Lord was first in our attentions.

Sometimes, I would even get quite frustrated by the siren calls of some of the other activities which wanted to encroach upon the attentions of worshipping the Lord on Sunday morning. As parents, we were as firm as we could be in protecting our focus to the Lord's day and still appreciative of our children's desire to follow through on using the gifts of our Lord, they were given.

It is true with all the wonderful opportunities we have each day living in God's creation that we have to work hard to keep our priorities straight. It is no different for me. But as "Old Shifter" and I go regularly on Thursdays for our wonderful "Pizza Night" pizzas, so too, it is a joy for "Old Shifter" and I, when we pull into the church parking lot to honor our Lord's Sabbath.
