My job was to explore the woods until I spotted the turkeys, and then chase them toward where my grandfather would lay in wait with his shotgun. Did I mention that he didn't have the best of vision?



I soon realized that hunting wasn't exactly my thing, and not catching anything that particular day didn't end up ruining Thanksgiving for us. If I'm being completely honest, I'm rather thankful that I didn't have the opportunity to chase any turkeys toward my grandfather. But I'm also thankful for the chance to spend time with my grandfather. We were definitely blessed.

Sometimes things don't go exactly as planned. I've seen it in my own life, and I'm sure most of you have seen it in yours. Things you were hoping to be thankful for don't work out, and sometimes we wonder what it is that we do have to be thankful for. At the same time, however, I believe that all of us have something that we can be thankful for. Maybe we're thankful for wonderful memories of years gone by, such as those I have with my grandfather. Maybe we're thankful for those who - in the midst of the occasional disappointment - continue to walk with us in our journey called life. And maybe we're simply thankful for the daily bread that we receive every day. For all that we have comes from God, and God has blessed so many of us far beyond our needs.

So I invite you all, look for the reasons to be thankful as we enter into this season of Thanksgiving. Look beyond just the reasons to the people who have been a part of your reasons to be thankful. For as we are thankful for one another - and we show it - thankfulness becomes contagious. Wherever we are, there is always a deeper reason to be thankful. For God who gives us every good gift has bound us together in our relationships and in our own stories of life. May all of us live into the generosity of God that we have been given. And may all of us be deeply, fully, thankful.


All Saints Sunday, celebrated on Sunday, November 6th, 2016 with the reading of the newest Messiah saints from November 01, 2015 to October 30 2016.

In the midst of headline news, social media tirades, uncertain times and constant disagreements about who we are and who we should be, it's hard to even know where to begin. We just know that we have a deep ache in our hearts that cries out for God's mercy and a longing to see healing in our land.

In all of the battles about the Presidential election - defending our views, pointing out our differences, scoffing at the opposing side and claiming that our side is the "Christian" side, we might ask ourselves this: Have we prayed about it as much as we have talked about it, worried about it, posted about it, and debated about it?

You are invited to join in an intentional time of prayer leading up to our national election as well as for the state and local elections. Here are 29 Bible passages and prayer points for you to consider. Feel free to use, share or formulate your own prayers. But, pray, we must! Blessings on you and yours as we journey towards the next election.

Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. - Colossians 4:2

Day 22 (11/1/16)

When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. -Leviticus 19:33-34

Holy One, give us wisdom. Throughout the scriptures, we read of how we are to treat the foreigner with respect and compassion and godly hospitality. This has become such a lightening rod issue in the US and throughout Europe. We know that by our birth, we have been born in a land of plenty. And we also know that there are many suffering throughout this world. It's complicated, Lord. Help make it clear how we should live and give in your gracious love.

Day 23 (11/2/16)

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. – Romans 8:26

Holy Spirit, thank you for helping us in our weakness (physically, mentally and spiritually). For you surely know that there are times we don't even know for what to pray or how to pray. Thank you for understanding our sighs and deep breaths and filling them with your prayers.

Day 24 (11/3/16)

I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. -2 Timothy I

Emmanuel, God with us, rekindle in all of us the spirit of love, power and self-discipline. Let us boldly be the people you call us to be – loving God with all of our hearts, soul and might and our neighbor as ourselves.

Day 25 (11/4/16)

"Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the LORD our God" -Psalm 20:7

Awesome God, our strength is in you. We sometimes forget this. As we are persuaded to buy more and more, surrounding ourselves with things we consider to be of beauty, usefulness, and protection, remind us it is you, O Lord, in whom we gain our worth.

Day 26 (11/5/16)

Give ear to my words, O LORD;
give heed to my sighing.

Listen to the sound of my cry,
my King and my God,
for to you I pray.

O LORD, in the morning you hear my voice;
in the morning I plead my case to you, and wait in expectation. —Psalm 5:1-3

Gracious God, we come before you today with thanksgiving and praise. You continue to hear the prayers of our hearts. We pray for those, Loving God, who don't turn to you for help, for comfort, for peace. Pour your grace upon them, Lord, so that they, too, have the desire to know you.

Day 27 (11/6/16)

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. —Hebrews 4:15-16






Wreath Meanings


