Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

"Gray Lady II" (my 2009 Toyota Tacoma pickup ministry partner) and I had gone to the clergy text study at Holy Cross, a couple weeks ago. We Lutheran clergy from around the Albuquerque meet on Tuesday every week to go over the lessons for the upcoming weekend, plus other ministry related items. Well, this particular Tuesday, Pastor Matt had asked me to host for him, because he was going to be gone. I had time to look around and read articles on bulletin boards at his church before people arrived.

One bulletin board caught my eye. It was filled with information about a place that they had connected and worked with in town. At our Vision Committee meeting we were talking about our community involvement, which is really good. "We are here for a reason" has been our mantra. Last year we picked up another connection through "Sew and Share", the Linus Project of quilts and blankets. Sharon and the other quilters showed some of the work they had been working on and would be donating at our worship service the end of April.

It was interesting that at our text study, out of the blue, Pastor Krista had mentioned that one of their groups from St. Luke had just been at this community help provider site. She was quite impressed. So, I told "Gray Lady II" about this coincidental

happening and I told her we should look into it. "Gray Lady II" agreed. As it turns out, we drive by the site twice almost every day and did not notice it. It is one Eubank, north of a few blocks from Lomas. So, last week, "Gray Lady II" and I went to their office and met with Connie. She talked to me about their mission and gave me a tour of facilities. Really a nice set up. When I got back in "Gray Lady II" I told her I would present them to our congregation and see if it would be another mission opportunity for our members.

The helping agency is called "Saranam" (A Refuge from Homelessness, A Journey Home). Their purpose statement: Saranam 's mission is to empower families to end their homelessness and poverty through housing, education and supportive communities.

I will expand on those three points from their brochure: <u>Housing Provides the Foundation</u>. A fully furnished apartment and living necessities provide stability for living. Families can then focus on addressing individual issues that created their homelessness. <u>Education Provides the Opportunity</u>. Adult education and life skills courses provide better employment opportunities for the future. Children also learn life skills and more to give them an advantage in life. <u>Community Provides the Support</u>. Community building is a unique element for ending homelessness. The development of a broad support system provides families a resource they have lost.

This introduction to you is an invitation to pray about a possible involvement in the mission work of Saranam. They look for many various styles of donations (see their request for needs to help incoming residents (Welcome Baskets) in this newsletter and on bulletin board) and various volunteer needs. Let Pastor or the Council know your feelings on this. Saranam will gladly sends a staff person to come and speak to our congregation and answer your questions.

Just a fun note from our travels across town: A tire and repair shop has painted on old tires by the road the different repair work they provide. "Gray Lady II" nudged me and said look at that tire it reads with this spelling: "Breaks." I smiled and wondered how they provided breaks and to whom. Also, "American Auto Clinic" had another newly presented witicism on their sign: "My wife says I do not listen to her or something like that."
