Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

I feel the most comfortable when I am living within my routines. It is not to say I am not able to alter my day to meet something which happens out of the blue. It is just nice when I wake up in the morning and ask myself, "What day is it?", to help my fading memory remember which day of the week it is. Upon that realization I am be able to say, "Today, this and that have to be done."

"Gray Lady II" affirmed this thought by pointing out that we almost always take the route to where we are going and seldom vary the way home. She told me she knows when I am going to mail letters or take recycling to the Edith waste management center by me not directing her to turn left on Menaul. We keep going straight one light north to Candelaria, for the post office site there.

My evening walks after eating supper (watching the last episodes of the evening for MASH and/or the Big Bang Theory), are basically at the same time and designation. I walk some blocks in the neighborhood and then go sit on a bench on the high spot of the neighborhood park. I rest there for a while, watch the same people (most with their dogs) arrive and move about. I also get to visit with a couple from All Saint's Lutheran Church when they come to walk their dog.

Apparently, I am not the only person with routines. In fact, it causes me concern when one of the regulars does not show up. It is the same in our immediate neighborhood. One of my neighbors across the street (a mother of quite advanced age and her son a decade younger than me) the other hot afternoon had not picked up their newspaper off their driveway. I was worried that something might be wrong because the son usually brings in the paper in

the morning. So, I went over to give them their paper and check on how they were. They were fine, my worry was unnecessary after all, and he thanked me for being concerned and giving him the paper. I laid it on their bench by the door (I did sanitize my hands before I picked up their paper) and I told him that the mail vehicle had already brought our mail.

The other day when "Gray Lady II" and I were driving over to Messiah, a gentleman with a fair size motorcycle went past us. I noticed that his brake lights were not fully functioning, like he had a short. Sometimes when he slowed down with the brake, the light came on, then it went out and then next time not on, then came on. He stopped next to "Gray Lady II" and I at a light and again it kept going off and on, not always the same one. So, I stuck my head out of the pickup and got his attention, told him what I noticed and he thanked me very much. He could have really gotten hurt if he got rear-ended.

Jesus told us that we should love the Father with all our hearts, soul and mind, and our neighbor as ourselves. These days of COVID-19 has really affected our routines and that of our neighbors. Those in the know speak a lot of how this is affecting our neighbors. If other people are like me, it is hard to not to be social and with routines/activities to help my day move along. Yet, even if we are more separated from our neighbors via the sequestering and limited out of home activity, we still need to be paying attention in whatever way possible to be there for them.

We need to stay in touch with each other the best we can. Social media does help in many cases, but there are some among us (like me) that does not partake in such activity. We need to go out of our way to pay attention to those folks. We need each other and many of us are used to having a lot going on about us. Even a wave and/or a distance "How's it going?" when a neighbor ventures out of their home, can be affirming and also lets them know we noticed their existence.

People need to know that we care. In a time like this which is filled with unknowns and directed seclusion, we can feel lost, maybe even abandoned. Keep a close eye and ear on how things are going for those about you, especially if you notice a drastic variation in their routine or mood. Pray for them in the name of our Risen Lord daily. Do your best to be their most concerned neighbor possible. Those you know be in contact with them by means of the telephone, mail or computer. Those you do not know as well, pause from what you are doing and give a wave.

People over age 60, those compromised immune systems, and anyone concerned about being infected with the COVID-19 virus should stay home.

Congregants must keep a distance of six feet from one another in all directions, and pews may be roped off. Members of the same family may sit together.

No handshaking or contact between people or families.

Anyone over the age of 3 must wear face covering except when they are speaking.

Cleaning staff are to disinfect commonly touched surfaces after each Mass, including pews, chairs, lecterns, door handles and rails. Restrooms are to be disinfected after each liturgy.

No open holy water should be present in churches.

Hymnals, missalettes and other prayer books should be removed.

There will be no congregational singing except by the cantor and one instrumentalist.

Collection baskets will not be passed and congregants are encouraged to use online giving. (We already do not pass the plate)

At MLC we believe that these guidelines will ensure the safety of our members and we will do our best to follow them. If you have any thoughts about this, please let us know.


