Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

We are rolling right along in the New Year of 2022. January is coming to its end and now February is ahead of us. We will still be in the season of Epiphany through the month. Ash Wednesday will be the first Wednesday in March. We will go from a season of enlightenment to a season of reflection, Lent. This transition from being informed to considering what it means to us is powerful for our faith and life.

"Gray Lady II" (my 2009 Toyota Tacoma pick-up ministry partner) and I travel a lot on the same streets each day. I will have to admit I am a routine person and if I find a way I like to travel, I do it as a regular option. I do survive detours, but I prefer not to have to hunt for different paths to get from point "a" to point "b". That being said, "Gray Lady II" and I see a lot of the same things every day. We anticipate what is ahead and pay attention to those driving around us. New things rarely show themselves upon our trips, but they do happen.

Our comfort zone is that nothing changes or something new avails itself. Yet, there are moments when we have to deal with the unsuspecting. Many of those things cause us to frown, but "Gray Lady II" and I try to make the best of it. Quite often those inconveniences or alterations to what we are used to be about or see are good.

On Menaul, when I got first started making my trips across town (this would even be before "Gray Lady II and I started working together) I would start seeing business after business closing down and gradually boarding up its windows. Now, some of them have put up fences to protect their property. It brought a sadness. Joy has unveiled itself, as at one of the closed businesses, over a period of time I watched it being transformed by construction workers into a new facility. I would ask my ministry partner, "What do you think will be there?" To my culinary excitement, it became "Stripes" restaurant. "Gray Lady II" and I pull into their drive-thru at least once a week on the way to Messiah to buy a "breakfast burrito, sausage, regular, with green chile".

As many of you know, my meal purchase of choice is a cheeseburger with fries, but to my surprise this food business has unveiled for me a surprising meal choice. In fact, I look forward to "Gray Lady II" pulling into line to order, my exact payment amount in hand before I had left home and the white bag, they give me after paying. It has pleasingly become a routine and essential part of my life.

Enlightenment is based on this unveiling of something that is available to know but not yet fully understood or seen. On Seven Bar Loop South by our house there are two lion likenesses on a fence to one of the houses overlooking the arroyo. "Gray Lady II" and I drive by them many times during the week. My wife and I have walked past them both for years as we go for our walks, usually to the "Deer Run" park. I had never noticed them. They were right there to see, but I apparently had others places to look and ponder, thereby, ignoring their presence. It was until an enlightenment moment by our granddaughter, being pushed in a stroller on one of our many walks, who yelled out, "Lions." She even made the "roar" of the lion as she pointed them out. I asked her where she saw them. She pointed up to them and there they were and probably had been for years, unbeknownst to me.


It is interesting how much we miss of the world and God about us because we are consumed with only the things which are a preoccupied with our own concerns and interests. The fact is, we all need to be enlightened each day and let that which is unveiled move us to a new vision and/or place. The Gospel lessons we had the last weeks of January from Luke Four is a microcosm of the problem the people of God had with living through being enlightened. What was unveiled to Jesus' hometown folk at the Synagogue should have been exciting and good news. It was what they had been praying for with Yahweh (God) providing a Messiah. Their lives and views of living in Yahweh's care was to be available to them, and all people, by Jesus' coming.

The problem was, not unlike all of us from time to time, the vision provided by Christ's enlightening declaration did not meet with what they were anticipating. This enlightenment said Yahweh was bringing hope and salvation to them through His Son. They were disappointed in said message. They had it all figured out how their lives should be affected by Yahweh's saving activity, and it did not necessarily mean a change in how they lived or viewed the world. Also, what did it mean that there would be those out of their little circle that Yahweh was concerned. Disappointed in what was unveiled before them in the synagogue, they became stiff-necked and angry. Yet, Jesus was not to be deterred or change His mission of salvation. Praise be to God.

Let this message from Christ be available to you as you look to be enlightened in ways to be a part of Christ's saving activity and His whole evangelical mission.
