

Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

"Gray Lady II" (2009 Toyota Tacoma), my ministry travels partner and I want to apologize that we did not have an article for you in May. We chose not to do a newsletter for lack of knowledge of what we were going to be able to do for worship and other activities of Messiah. We pray that you have been doing okay over these past months of being sequestered.

"Gray Lady II" and I have to admit there has been a little bit of selfish appreciation over the lack of traffic because sadly there were not a lot of people on the road. We could get across town so much faster, but we admit, we would rather have the traffic than people being out of work. I was talking to "Gray Lady II" one morning driving over to Messiah how eerie it was not to have a vehicle within blocks ahead of us. I could barely see its brake lights when it stopped at a light because it was so far away. We did not have to worry about rear-ending it, that was for sure.

We have noticed the past couple weeks as the businesses and other places were beginning to open, more traffic. "Gray Lady II" told me she was glad to have more friends about her as we traveled across town. It is a good feeling sensing that people were beginning to get back to their "normal" activities. I am glad that we are able now to start having people for worship. It was good to be able to do ZOOM. What I found interesting about using it with no congregants before me how when I am leading worship and preaching, I watch you folks for cues. You make worship leading so much easier than you probably realize.

I was talking to "Gray Lady II" over the past weeks about the things my wife and I have been doing while staying at home. She has left the shopping to "Gray Lady II" and me. Some of what we did while at home in the afternoons and evenings fell into a pretty good routine. Mary being an essential worker would get home from work and we would either go for a walk before or after supper.

We had not done jigsaw puzzles for quite a while and now in the afternoons we have been doing them unless I was doing yard work. Then in the evening we would read. We have been going through books. (I am glad that the used book store is now back open, with appropriate precautions.)

I want to share with you a reflection on all the "free" time I have for yard work (no excuses available like before being daily self-secluded at home). "Gray Lady II" and I were out for a drive and we saw a sign draped over a wall behind a house facing a street intersection. We laughed when we read it, "Help! If the COVID19 virus doesn't kill me the honey-do list will."

Upon review of the past months, I have found that our home lifestyle had not really changed a lot. We really do not do much. We do miss going out to eat at a restaurant once in a while. An occasional movie or opera, but we live pretty frugally. (No cable, dish, Wi-Fi or internet, and most evening television over the air at night is not very interesting.) We have been trying to support stores which can do carry-out or curb-side business. It hurts me deeply to consider 49 million Americans who have filed for unemployment (as of 5/28). I cannot imagine their plight and pray that things will quickly turn around for them.

It must be hard for those struggling through these months and the unknown of the months ahead. Matthew 6:25 states, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?" We need to help each other find the faithful trust of these words and Jesus promise that the Father is watching over us. It is not always easy to hold fast to this truth, especially when our lives and wherewithal are so dearly distressed. But we need to help each other that all is in our Lord's care and we have His strength through His Spirit to get through the stress and fears of the day.

I pray that all of you will be able to weather these days with very little problem. The Lord is with you. Verse 33 reads great words of hope for now and forever, "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. You are a good people, especially in God's eyes, and may your goodness help lift each other above the problems of today.

I would like to close with an interesting trivial thing which humors my oddness and I hope you do not mind me sharing it with you. Like I was saying above, I have been doing a lot of reading. In the past weeks, I have read two books by different authors, with a book or two between them. I read Steve Berry's "The Malta Exchange" and the later Clive Cussler and Robin Burchell's book "The Oracle." (You might enjoy the 97 proverbs, mostly African, which head each chapter.) Well, why reading "The Oracle" part of the plot had a penta-palindrome (I believe that is what it called it.) "sator." tied into the God of Saturn and the Saturnina festival.

While reading "The Oracle", a bell went off in my head, did not one of the other books I had just recently read have the same device as part of the story plot. I went back to the Steve Berry book and there it was. This time as part of the story line formed around Constantine and the Christian tradition. The two-story lines from each book were about a thousand years apart and on opposite sides of the Mediterranean Sea. I will say no more as to not ruin the reading of these books for you. I just found it interesting. Have a wonderful day. God blesses.

People over age 60, those compromised immune systems, and anyone concerned about being infected with the COVID-19 virus should stay home.

Congregants must keep a distance of six feet from one another in all directions, and pews may be roped off. Members of the same family may sit together.

No handshaking or contact between people or families.

Anyone over the age of 3 must wear face covering except when they are speaking.

Cleaning staff are to disinfect commonly touched surfaces after each Mass, including pews, chairs, lecterns, door handles and rails. Restrooms are to be disinfected after each liturgy.

No open holy water should be present in churches.

Hymnals, missalettes and other prayer books should be removed.

There will be no congregational singing except by the cantor and one instrumentalist.

Collection baskets will not be passed and congregants are encouraged to use online giving. (We already do not pass the plate)

At MLC we believe that these guidelines will ensure the safety of our members and we will do our best to follow them. If you have any thoughts about this, please let us know.


