Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

We are getting closer to longer and warmer days. When "Gray Lady II" (my 2009 Toyota Tacoma pickup and ministry partner) and I are finding out now that the sun is a little more of a challenge when traveling east on Menaul on our way to church. It is almost blinding in its intensity. The sun is welcomed but makes driving a bit of a challenge.

Another thing "Gray Lady II" and I have been in conversation about over the last few months is the increased amount of others sharing the road with us. Admittedly, some sharing it better than others. But I guess for the economy and psychological well-being of our community the increase in people also on the road is a good thing. Now, if we could just keep down the accidents.

I remember a little less than a year ago, "Gray Lady II" and I talked about how we almost owned the roads as we had the very restrictive stay home health orders. It is almost hard to believe that we have been in a health order from the State of New Mexico for close to a year. I think March 11, 2020 (or about then), was when we had to restructure our daily lives and works to protect from the COVID-19 pandemic. They have hampered us is a variety of ways, but we have persevered.

Once we were restricted from many of our favorite activities, like going to worship at Messiah, I changed the sign out in front of our church. I strongly believed and wanted to share with all those traveling by our church and struggling in their own ways. Those words on the sign have always been true for Christians over the two-thousand years. "Christ is our hope and strength." I make sure that in my morning prayers that I always ask the Lord to be our hope and strength, and I wholly believe He has been doing it. He will continue to do it.

By the grace of our Lord and help of our dedicated members, we have been able to find ways to worship and help those in need. We have been on ZOOM since Palm Sunday. ZOOM was not something at that time I was familiar with, but the Lord provided those who did to help us. I am still pretty ignorant on the ZOOM subject. I do know though that the Lord will continue to provide people who can help me get the hang of it and that we can use it to the advantage of others, in the name of the Lord's earthly ministry.

"Gray Lady II" has mentioned her being impressed that this imposition placed before us, that I have dragged myself out of my comfort zone. She knows how hard it is for me to move forward with change. I like things that I have come to do and do proficiently. I did not say great, just proficiently. Routine is my go-to point and using what I have come to know for as long as I can. I have not changed vehicles very often. Usually, it is not until I have to because they wear out or they have outlived their dependability (like my knees). "Old Blue" (my 1973 Ford F100 pickup ministry partner from 1984-2001) was an eyesore but dependable up to the time with 267,000 miles on he; her heads went, a devastating malady. We had to part with tearfully. I keep my shoes until they fall apart, especially when the soles allow water to flow in.

Then May seventeenth provided another movement in our hope and strength to provide the word and sacraments of the Lord in a more personal way. We opened our doors for both in house and ZOOM worship. We followed the proscribed health mandate restrictions and worked hard to protect as well as provide for those who wanted to be in some way together for worship. As we gather, either by ZOOM or in person, the Lord works through us and for each us to provide hope and strength through that which confounds and concerns us—COVID-19.

Ultimately, as we are able to find ways to worship and have our meetings, it is the Lord who helps us prevail. We have analyzed the problems we have, and the Lord has given us wisdom to see that we get His work done. We were able to have our Christmas Eve Candlelight service and Ash Wednesday services. Who would have known that we could have those services, but the Lord. He rose up ideas in our membership and with great joy and volunteer work, we were able to have wonderful worship services.

Mostly, I want to thank the Lord for His presence in our life and His guidance to help us live our lives not in morose over how things are but live our lives following His care with hope and strength. We do not know what is ahead for us over the next months, but we do know one thing, Christ will not leave us alone. Let me close with Paul's thoughts as I paraphrase his words from 1 Corinthians 1:24b-25. "Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God. For foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." Rest in the comfort of knowing that our hope and strength is securely founded on the fact that our Lord is all knowing, all powerful and all present in His world and our lives. He has promised to be with us always.
