Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

"Gray Lady II" (my 2009 Tacoma pickup ministry partner) and I drive all around town, and in other towns, quite frequently. We see all kinds of different things as we roam about these communities. Sometimes, we are looking for very specific places and other times we are just getting from point A to point B. Besides road signs and lights (which we try to honor at all times) there are signs which do advertising and/or giving information. Some are large commercial signs and some are homemade.

"Gray Lady II" and I like to go to yard sales. Those signs usually are smaller, some colorful with arrows, of which we follow to buy things we just have to have and to visit with the sellers. Estate sale signs are quite similar. People put up these signs because they have a need to be relieved of some of the items they have and they make witness to it by those signs.

In our neighborhood, presently, we have signs on wheels giving witness that for so many days we will have to find another way to travel because of roadwork. Those signs of witnessing to an activity which would cause detouring out of the way help with making travel quicker and safer, going another way. If you do not pay attention to their witness, you could end up disappointed by the diversion, and maybe even late to your destination.

Quite often we see all kinds of signs which advertise, giving witness to their business. When we are traveling "Gray Lady II" and I depend on those signs to tell us where we could find a place to eat or if we are away from home, a place to stay. They give all the positives of which they could think of and place on the defined dimensions of the sign. I do not believe that I have read any (unless it is one of trying to be humorous and catch my attention) which speak of how awful their product or hospitality is.

Some are a little vague in their messaging. Those signs tend to be a little more user specific. People who are in tune with their offerings grasp the messaging more easily than somebody out of the loop. Case in point would be some advertising signs which are about town and represent the medical procedure clinic my son-in-law works. "Gray Lady II" and I had seen those signs, read their witness, shrugged with indifference, and moved along the road to new signs. Now that my son-in-law works there and I know what they do to save peoples' lives, we acknowledge them with more interest.

Jesus had exhorted his followers to be witnesses of the salvation for which He had provided to all who had "ears" to hear. Their witness was to be clear and offered with peace to all they came in contact. All people have the opportunity to live in Christ's mercy, grace, forgiveness and power. Jesus through His entrance into our world, His ministry, His teaching, His death, resurrection and ascension, all people who wish to have them in His life are able. There is no one to be on the outside of this witness. All should be able to easily accept and understand. The witness of His followers would be a sign to the world of the presence of pure and gracious love of a God who truly cares and is not hiding His grace.

Acts 5:12, "Now many signs and wonders were done among the people through the apostles ("witnesses" of Christ)." As we read on in the text, people took to heart the witness and the healing activities flowing from their efforts, and witness through signs and wonders. It was not an easily accepted activity by some who wanted them to stop speaking in Jesus' name. In fact, those in opposition, would not even say Jesus' name.


As you read through the witnesses of Christ, they were thrown in jail, freed by an "angel of the Lord," back at the Temple teaching and then arrested quietly again. Witnessing for the goodness which comes from knowing Christ as one's Lord, can not be stifled. The "goods" which the disciples were witnessing were so powerful and glorious, they could not be ignored.

Gamaliel, a great teacher of the law [Saul's teacher] and was revered amongst his peers says it best in verses thirty-eight and thirty-nine, "So in the present case, I tell you (the leaders trying to quiet the witness of the disciples), keep away from these men and let them alone; because if this plan or this undertaking is of human origin [of no value], it will fail; but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them—in that case you may even be found fighting against God."

The Risen Christ is the real deal and our true path to salvation and righteousness. Any witness offering earnestly His glory, can not be overthrown or stifled. Witness and be glad in Him.
