Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

It has been a little more enjoyable for "Gray Lady II" (my 2009 gray Toyota Tacoma pickup) and I to be driving about town. The travel across town begins cool and dark. Quite a relief from the sweltering hot travels of August and early September. She and I have even noticed more businesses being open during the day.

These open businesses have done their best to survive the close down of the early months of the COVID-19 health requirements for the public. We have noticed that there are many with outdoor tents and barricades about the shops and restaurants. Almost all people are wearing masks. Social distancing inside and out are being respected. Many that allow people inside have chairs and tables either removed or strategically placed. It is interesting seeing the new industry which has come to fruition, face masks and shields. The masks are not only made for function, but also to be stylish. Almost all stores have a section now for masks and antiseptic solution.

We are a people who appreciate what we are able to do and receive. We are a people who have a great capacity to adapt for the better given a chance. We are a clever people and we can be quite agreeable with good purpose. Just the other day "Gray

Lady II" and I were out doing garage sale shopping, looking for some particular items. At one place, a woman had a large collection of masks. I asked her if she made them and she said yes, for herself and a company out of Taos. She had made over 500 by the time of my visit. I bought two from her. I liked the distinct look and work, and I wanted to support her use of her gifts.

As I was sharing my thoughts with "Gray Lady II" she interjecting a consideration quite close to home for her. She so appreciates the maintenance that CarER does for her. When the COVID-19 health orders and fears came out months ago, she was worried that her favorite vehicle care center would close. It was close. The owner was shut down for a while and then when he did open up the regular customers were leery of coming in the shop or letting people in their vehicle.

"Gray Lady II" became quite despondent as I told her I did not know what I was going to do to keep her fluids fresh and her running smoothly. When it got close to the time for her next checkup and refreshing, by the grace of God, CarER was able to be reopened. The owner had to cut back on days they were open, and we had to make an appointment. Usually, for the regular maintenance we could just stop by but now it was more complicated. The customer would have to wear a mask while entering the shop office.

We were so glad that she could be taken care of, but even more so, that her place of care was open. We knew it was not easy for the owner. The business' income, for lack of customers and wanting to keep his dedicated staff on the payroll, was way below the old days. We are so appreciative of CarER doing their best to deal with the recent problems and take care of us. "Gray Lady II" has been so thankful for their efforts she has me stop by periodically and drop off some money for their lunchtime, as they work straight through to satisfy their customers' needs.

Jesus during His time on earth spent much time with the disciples (and us) working to help them come to understand their role following His resurrection. Things were not going to be easy. Not every day they were going to be hailed as wonderful as they worked to be evangelists of the Gospel message. We can read in the New Testament the threats placed against them as they went from community to community. 


