Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

We are now officially into the season of Fall. "Gray Lady II" (My 2009 Tacoma pickup ministry partner) and I are really appreciative of its arrival. "Gray Lady II" was commenting to me how thankful she was not to have the sun beating down on her outer shell and interior cab compartment. I know it has to be hard on all her parts with the scorching heat we have had over the last months. She would mention how blessed she would feel when we had a full day of overcast; and even more so, when it rained.

I told her I felt the same way. Scorching heat did not do anything necessarily good for my outer shell, or inner compartments. I had to drink a lot of water to stay ahead of the moisture I was losing. I am surprised that "Gray Lady II" did so well helping me get to places around town in such heat. We had to not only deal with the heat of the day, but also the residual effects on the roads of constant heat.

Maybe, she and I, should be thankful that we are able to complain. The complaining shows us that we are alive and functioning. Such thinking reminds me of what is commonly said about getting older, "It is better than the alternative." Point well taken and I am thankful for each day.

This thinking of being thankful really hit home for me as we have been working the last weeks through the "Passion Predictions" of Jesus. In Mark, three times He declares what was just a

short time away to His disciples the cruelty which was instore for Him in Jerusalem. Even though the disciples (and probably us if we had been there) struggled to really come to grips with this Suffering Messiah coming into our world to die for our sins and defeat death for us, Jesus went to Jerusalem and fulfilled His prophecy and promise.

Just think of what must have been going through His mind at the Last Supper. Jesus was sitting there at table and eating with the disciples. Jesus took that gathering as a time to offer a special sacramental moment. We now celebrate in our worship the Eucharist while he feeds us for living through His body and Blood. He knew what the next week was going to bring, and in human terms, it was not going to be pleasant. Even with people looking to do Him harm, at the time of this meal He did it with grace and thankfulness. He twice gave thanks to His Father in heaven—once taking up the cup and once again after breaking the bread. The Son of God showed pure faithfulness to the task at hand with thanks.

As I discussed this with "Gray Lady II", she pointed out we should be thankful each day, because none of them are going to be as bad as Jesus' last days. He did not have to go to the Cross for us and be beaten and crucified for our sins, but He chose to out of His love. How would we be able to offer that last meal of grace know that we were going to be betrayed into the hands of those who found us a pain in their side. Such an annoyance that the event would be considered expedient by the haters.


It made me think of all the times I could have taken the time to be grateful and expressed it. I took that moment in our conversation to give thanks to "Gray Lady II" directly and deeply (while also remembering those before her who were my previous ministry partners) for her dependability and faithfulness. I also gave thanks to my Lord and Savior for providing her as my assistant, and even more so, Jesus who through the Holy Spirit invited me into His victory through the Cross and Resurrection.

I am sure over the years the Lord has provided so many wonderful and helpful people into my life and ministry, and I have not shared fully my appreciation for their company and efforts. Let me take this moment to share my deepest thanks to all of you who are part of my life and ministry for all that you have done; efforts large and small; recognized and unrecognized." And not let me forget all those who have forged out of me a man of many years one I hope they would be proud of and thankful they had a chance to know me, as I do them. Lest I forget, my family and friends thankfully fill my life with more than I could have ever imagined, and I thank the Lord, each day in my prayers.

The Lord at many times in His time on earth took time to say thanks to the Father. May we each day find time and ways to do the same with our Lord. If I had to pick a favorite thought in my relationship for which to earnestly give the Lord thanks, it was when He said in His last recorded words from St. Matthew's Gospel, "An behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Mt. 28:20b) Thank you Lord Jesus. Amen.

RISING SUN CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY

WORSHIP at Messiah - 2021

We will continue doing our worship by ZOOM and with some in church worshipers. We pray that this has helped you stay in touch with the Word of the Lord and each other. We have also been emailing or mailing Exposition of the Weekly Worship and Lessons. We have been allowing a member to worship on site, following all the appropriate health precautions. We are getting a nice group of worshipers at Messiah on Sunday each week. We are now having a "Grab and Go/Stay and Chat" following worship in the Fellowship Hall. We keep working to offer the best worship and Bible Study opportunities possible. Thank you to Brian and Cassandra, K. D. Pass, Rosemary Butler, Steve McHenry, and Tony for making all this possible.

WORSHIP with our more traditional Holy Communion----Our plan was for the Sunday worship service on June 13, 2021, 9:30 am, to move closer to our traditional way of doing Holy Communion during the service. It went pretty well and we had a large number of worshipers. Those of you who have been worshiping in the sanctuary know that for the past many months we have limited movement during the service and masks were mandatory. Well, the State of New Mexico has lessened the need to keep on masks on in public inside events, like worship. So if you wish to not where a mask and have been fully vaccinated, you have that option.

Our worship services now-- when it is time to for the sacred elements distribution, you will be asked to come up around the altar, be before the altar railings or stay in your pew, and we will serve you. Please do keep in mind social distancing no matter what you choose.

Pastor will bring the bread (wafer) to each person and another person will follow with the trays of filled disposable wine cups (safely space away from each other on the tray). There will be no words shared and each person is to hold the elements until Pastor gets back in front of the ZOOM camera at the altar. Pastor will make sure all people are ready to receive the elements, both in house and on ZOOM, so we can receive the sacrament as a full community of Christ. Then the Pastor will say, "The body of Christ given for you, amen," and everyone will eat the body, and then "The blood of Christ shed for you, amen," again all will drink.

Once all have received the Body and Blood, the Pastor will bless the meal. Those not in their seats will return to their pews, giving space for each returning and dispose of the cups in the trash can in the aisle. We are still trying to see how this all flows and when we will sing the Communion Hymn, while returning to their pews. It may take us a couple of weeks to get this all moving smoothly. God bless.

Albuquerque Refugee & Asylee Programs Donation List

Thank you for thinking of LFS for your donations of furniture and household goods! When a refugee family arrives, LFS secures an apartment and furnishes the apartment with all the basic necessities. We rely on donations of new and gently used items from the community to be able to give refugees a warm welcome! For large items and furniture we are able to pick-up Monday-Friday, but please understand that we are a small operation and so we are generally not able to pick up with short notice. Please call our office in advance to schedule. Thank you for your generosity!

We accept the following new or gently used items.

Furniture:

- Bed frame (twin/full/queen)
- Dressers or chest of drawers
- Small couches or loveseats
- Lamps and light bulbs
- Kitchen/dining table and chairs
- Living room chairs
- Coffee table/side tables
- Nightstands

Linens:

- Bath towels, hand towels, and washcloths
- Sheet sets (twin, full, queen)
- Blankets and bedspreads
- Pillows (new only)
- Curtains
- Shower curtain

Kitchen Items:

- Utensils
- Dishes (plates, bowls, cups)


